1. TUITION

Tuition is paid through Smart Tuition Management Company. Plans include monthly, semi-annual and yearly payment. For bookkeeping purposes, all families must enroll in Smart Tuition. Choice of payment plan must be made at the time of registration. Registration fees are non-refundable.

3. PARENT SERVICE HOURS

Parents are required to fulfill a minimum of 20 hours of service during the school year (a minimum of 10 hours for single family households). Service hours are important because they support the greater needs of the school community and help limit the need for paid assistance. At the end of the school year, parents will be billed at a rate of \$20 per hour for all unfulfilled hours.

4. GROWING FOR YOU FUND

Annual tuition at St. Lucy's covers only a portion of the true cost of educating each student. During the first year of their daughter's enrollment at St. Lucy's, all parents are asked to make a pledge of \$4,000 to the school through the Growing for You Fund. This 100 percent tax-deductible gift is payable over the four years of their daughter's enrollment, and allows the school to continue meeting operational needs and planning for the future.

Once all the necessary information has been received, the Admissions Review Board will examine applications and notify families by letter of their decision in early March 2018. Attendance at a Registration session, required forms and payment of registration are part of the Admissions process.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer students applying for the Sophomore or Junior year must send current transcripts, have a minimum grade of "B" in academic classes and a minimum of a "C" or better in all other classes. Acceptance of transfer students depends on present enrollment and available openings.

HISTORY

ABOUT ST. LUCY'S



St. Lucy's Priory High School is a private four-year secondary school for girls located at 655 West Sierra Madre Avenue in the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains in Glendora, California.

The building was completed in 1963 and was formally dedicated February 2, 1964 by Cardinal James McIntyre. Continuous growth of the student body has necessitated several renovations and additions. The multipurpose gymnasium was completed in May of 1981 and additional classrooms were completed during the 1996 school year.

St. Lucy's Priory High School is owned and operated by the Benedictine Sisters who established their priory in Glendora, California, in 1952. Since the founding of St. Lucy's Priory High School, the Benedictine Sisters, faculty and staff continue to give dedicated service to the students.

ORDER OF ST. BENEDICT (O.S.B.)



Benedictines were among the very first monastic communities in the Western World. St. Benedict founded the monastery of Monte Cassino outside of Rome in the sixth century.

The communities that followed him and his twin sister, St. Scholastica, have always tried to answer the needs of the local areas in which they lived. Benedictines have been missionaries, teachers, farmers, librarians, and musicians and have led lives of peace and prayer over the last fifteen hundred years. The communities came to the United States in the 1800's to serve the growing immigrant populations of this nation. Over the years, the Benedictine Sisters of St. Lucy's Priory High School have taught in various local grade schools, such as Sacred Heart (Covina), Our Lady of the Assumption, St. Charles, St. Christopher's, St. Dorothy's, St. Frances of Rome, St. John the Baptist and Bishop Amat High School. They also served in the following San Diego area schools: Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Sacred Heart, St. Mary's and St. Rose of Lima.

MISSION



St. Lucy's Priory High School, a Roman Catholic private girls' school, is dedicated to providing a college preparatory education founded in the Benedictine tradition and committed to faith formation rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The school community cultivates the values of Christian womanhood and leadership in a safe and diverse environment, empowering students to be spiritual, educated, integrated and collaborative women.

St. Lucy's educates students to think critically and communicate effectively in order to positively impact society in the 21st century.

By providing opportunities for faith-centered service, St. Lucy's engages students in the global community and challenges them to respond compassionately to the needs of others, creating a more just world.

ACCREDITATION

St. Lucy's Priory High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, a regional accrediting association recognized by the California Office of Education and the National Commission of Accrediting. St. Lucy's was first accredited in 1967 and is presently accredited through 2020.

St. Lucy's Priory High School is also accredited by the Western Catholic Educational Association.

St. Lucy's Priory High School is accredited by the Board of Admissions and Relations with Schools of the University of California.



The Benedictine Sisters founded St. Lucy's Priory High School based on their traditions of work, worship, community, hospitality and peace. These traditions continue to guide decision-making and future planning for school governance, curriculum, student life and resource management.

St. Lucy's Priory High School, a Roman Catholic girls' school, teaches the message of Jesus Christ and upholds the beliefs and teachings of the Church. St. Lucy's invites students to deepen their spirituality and to integrate their faith into an academic curriculum. Students, parents, faculty and staff live Christian values in a worshipping and ministering community. The school recognizes the many gifts of a diverse student body and challenges the students

to think and believe in ways that foster intellectual growth, nurture faith and motivate action within the school, the larger community and the world.

St. Lucy's Priory High School is a college preparatory institution providing a curriculum that prepares students for success in higher education. The school promotes academic excellence as well as a commitment to lifelong learning. The school affirms parents, teachers and students as sharing the responsibility for student learning.

As a women's school, St. Lucy's enjoys a unique opportunity to cultivate student self-awareness, confidence and leadership. St. Lucy's students are empowered to be successful women in a global society.

SPIRITUAL LIFE



St. Lucy's students are encouraged to grow spiritually toward mature Christian womanhood. Students are required to take four years of religion classes that include the study of scriptures, morality, sacraments, social justice, church history and Christian vocations. All texts are in conformity with the Bishop's Curriculum Framework.

Morning prayers are shared over the PA with the entire student body. Eucharistic celebrations are held throughout the year and the prayer room is available for daily prayer. St. Lucy's offers a comprehensive retreat program beginning freshmen year and culminating with the senior Kairos retreat.

St. Lucy's students put their faith into action in school-sponsored works of compassion, peace and justice, as well as activities sponsored by their local communities, churches and other communities of worship.

Non-catholic students are admitted to the school and they are expected to attend regular religion classes and liturgical services on those occasions when the student body or the particular class is assembled. St. Lucy's seeks to include all students in forming a community of prayer and respect.

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ST. LUCY'S PRIORY HIGH SCHOOL: COLLEGE PREPARATORY

St. Lucy's provides a rigorous and challenging academic program. Students must complete a minimum of seven courses per semester. Requirements include four years of English, Religion and Social Studies, three years of Mathematics and Science, two years of Foreign Language, and one year of Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Education. Electives are offered to juniors and seniors.

The curriculum includes honors level courses in English, Math, Science and Social Studies. Advanced Placement courses are offered in Biology, Calculus, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, European History, Psychology, Spanish Language, United States Government and Politics and United States History.

The school year is divided into two semesters, using a modified block schedule. Classes are assigned five units of credit per semester.

College Admissions: Each year 100% of graduates go on to college with approximately 89% attending four-year colleges and universities that include Ivy League, UC, CSU, private, out-of-state and military academies. Graduates are admitted to a variety of colleges and universities across the globe.

PARENT PARTICIPATION PROGRAM



Parents are vital to the success of the school. All parents are automatically members of the Parent Club and invited to become active participants. The Parent Club assists in providing social, spiritual, educational, moral and financial support to the school. Parents support participation in school activities and assist in raising supplementary funds to augment school needs. The involvement of parents also helps to develop a spirit of Christian community and mutual support.

Parent Service Hours are an essential component of the Parent Participation Program. Parents are required to participate in 20 service hours per year (10 hours for single parents). The Office of Advancement regularly notifies parents about service hour opportunities. At the end of the 2018–2019 school year, parents will be billed at the rate of \$25 per hour for all unfulfilled hours. All financial obligations, including fundraising obligations and parent hours, must be completed by the end of the year in order for students to participate in graduation activities, take final exams, and/or receive report cards.
