## COMMUNITY

St. Lucy's is located in the suburban Los Angeles community of Glendora, a city of about 50,000 people. Students come from about 55 schools in various middle to upper-middle class communities in the San Gabriel and Pomona Valleys.

## SCHOOL

St. Lucy's Priory High School, founded by the Benedictine Sisters in 1962, is a private Roman Catholic school for women, grades 9-12, accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, the Western Catholic Education Association, and affiliated with the University of California Board of Admissions and Relations with Schools. St. Lucy's is a college preparatory, liberal arts institution. Admission is based on STS High School Placement Test scores, grades and recommendations. The 2017-2018 enrollment is 542 students with a senior class of 159. The school population is 77% Catholic and 69% minority (3% Asian/Pacific Islander; 8% Filipino; 1% African-American; 1% Native-American; 36% Hispanic; 17% Multi-Racial). The student-teacher ratio is 16-1.

## MISSION

St. Lucy's Priory High School, a Roman Catholic private girls' school, is dedicated to providing a college preparatory education founded in the Benedictine tradition and committed to faith formation rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The school community cultivates the values of Christian womanhood and leadership in a safe and diverse environment, empowering students to be spiritual, educated, integrated and collaborative women. St. Lucy's educates students to think critically and communicate effectively in order to positively impact society in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. By providing opportunities for faith-centered service, St. Lucy's engages students in the global community and challenges them to respond compassionately to the needs of others, creating a more just world.

### Academic Pattern

## GRADING

G.P.A. is calculated on a 4.0 scale and is weighted with an extra point for A.P. classes and Chemistry Honors. G.P.A. does not include summer school nor online courses taken elsewhere. G.P.A. includes every graded courses except P.E. A weighted rank-in-class is computed at the end of each semester. Class rank is provided on request and is posted on the transcript.
